MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID CLASS: Join in the conversation and community effort to reduce stigma and the silence that surrounds mental illness by taking an Adult Mental Health First Aid Class April 24 and May 1 from 3:30 - 8:00 pm. Understanding, knowledge, and skills learned in class can result in giving hope and even in saving lives. It is an eight hour class which prepares participants to recognize signs and symptoms of mental health concerns and then assist the person with a five step action plan. **This class is open to everyone—professionals and lay persons.** Participants receive a certificate from the National Council for Behavioral Health.
