

"He leadeth me on the paths of righteousness for his name's sake." Psalm 23:3

The Shepherd's Psalm, or Psalm 23 as we know it, is a perennial favorite of Christians of all denominations and probably the passage of scripture that most of us know the best. Yet, how many of us have truly closely examined these cherished phrases for what they really mean? I could preach for a month or two just on these 6 verses, but allow me to resist that temptation here and just nibble a bit on one morsel rather than set the whole feast.

Sheep are skittish animals that on the fight or flight continuum max out pretty much on the flight end, ready to flee from any possible danger. It is the shepherd's job to protect the sheep from anything or anyone that might harm them as well as any dangers they might cause themselves. The sheep know the voice of their shepherd and will follow only that voice and no other as Jesus reminded his disciples.

Once on a family outing to my dad's home place in Yancey County, NC, I took off into the woods fancying myself as quite the woodsman to rival Daniel Boone. Somehow in those unfamiliar woods, I got disoriented and did not know where to turn to get out of those woods and back with my family. My ten-year-old heart was getting close to panic, when suddenly I heard my dad's voice, and followed THAT voice. It was amazing to me to realize how close he really had been to me the entire time.

Life holds an abundance of fearful moments when we are disoriented and have no clue as to which way to turn or how to extract ourselves from certain unpleasant situations. The Psalmist reminds us to listen for the voice of our shepherd, guardian, protector, and comforter. If only we will stop long enough to listen carefully, we may find that our shepherd has never been far away from us at all and the only thing that has created even the smallest of distances is our own roaming, our own overconfidence in our own abilities.

Never forget to listen for your shepherd's voice.
