# YOUTH SHARE IMPACT OF MISSION TRIPS



On August 30 our youth and their adult chaperones shared stories of how their lives were changed this summer while serving on 3 separate Mission Trips. Our youth worked with Carolina Cross Connection (CCC) and ministered to people through home repairs in Wilkes County, built relationships with orphans in Honduras and the homeless in Asheville.

One of the youth, Emma Aldridge, spoke about pure joy and simple things. Each of our mission trips embraced this joy as we met our homeowners, played with children in the orphanages and talked with our new friends in Asheville. Emma explained that God's huge miracles are told throughout the scriptures. One of those miracles is when Jesus brought Lazarus back to life, telling him to rise up. Emma stated that God's little miracles are all around us every day. We see them in creation, we hear them in our heartbeats and we feel them in the touch of shaking someone's hand.
