

This morning I had need to go into the sanctuary and have a meeting with God at the altar. Yes, often we pastors must do that. Part of my prayer time while kneeling there was the prayer familiar to all of us; the one Jesus taught his disciples upon their request that he teach them to pray. In Jan Karon's series of stories from her Mitford Series, Father Tim calls it the perfect prayer. John Wesley stated, "This prayer, uttered from the heart, and in its true and full meaning, is indeed the badge of a real Christian." Well, that is no doubt true, but, we know it so well and recite it with such ease, do we truly attend to what we are saying? There is an entire series of sermons in that last statement, but my heart and mind are focused on the line quoted above.

We are asking God's will be done as thoroughly and completely on earth as it is carried out in heaven. Do we REALLY want that? I hope and trust we do, but as I look at the behavior of Christians on the news as well as many I have been personally associated or acquainted with over the years, I question if we earnestly make that plea. It seems to me that too many of God's people want to tell God what God's will is rather than seek what God's will is for them. As I watch the nightly news, that sort of attitude seems to creep out in the behavior of some "Christians" in the form of racism, sexism, ethnic biases and a number of other issues in which some of us feel certain that God stands with us in our opinions. Let's not assume too much.

Whereas, I have yet to witness that sort of thing here at Elkin FUMC, (thank you), what does this observation have to do with us? First of all, as we pray, we had better understand and mean what we pray. Secondly, we have an obligation to teach our children that we are here to do God's will, not that we are to plan God's will or that God should ever abide by our ideals. Our children, and new Christians, as well must understand that we represent God in this world and how vastly important it is that we do so honestly and correctly thus providing an appropriate witness. We are called to God's will and it seems that it would be a much better world if we lived and taught that by word and action as Christians and the people called Methodist.


