

URGENT NEED FOR BACKPACK PROGRAM SUPPLIES: School is back in session and we are once again collecting items for the Backpack Program at the local schools. Supplies are extremely low right now as the school year begins. Each week teachers send home food for Saturday and Sunday for the students who can't afford or don't have access to food for the weekend. Suggested items are: flip top canned items or peel off lids (ravioli, spaghetti, soups, mac-n-cheese, fruit cups, pudding). They also need: cereal, granola bars, peanut butter, jelly, fruit gummy snacks, "Lance" crackers and juice boxes. The collection box is located in the entryway near the Church Office.
