CAPITAL FUND UPDATE

As of August 31, 2017, the Capital Fund Balance was \$33,896.38. At the last Trustee meeting on September 12, 2017, the recommendation was that the \$6,075.72 in van fund donations be returned to the Church Reserve Fund. This will leave a Capital Fund balance of \$27,820.66.

The estimate for completing repair/replacement of steps and handrails at the front and East side of the Sanctuary entrances is \$25,000. The recommendation of the Trustees is that \$17,000 of the \$27,820.66 be used for the step project leaving \$10,820.66 in the Capital Fund to serve as a hedge against additional facility needs. A combination of building maintenance funds and donations will make up the additional \$8,000 necessary to complete the step project. The plan is to complete repairs/replacement by the end of this November.

Expenses for updating the sound system currently exceed donations by \$670.00, but additional funds have been pledged to cover all remaining expected costs. As of now, it is projected that it will cost between \$7,000 and \$8,000 to finish this project.

"A woman had ten silver coins, if she loses one of them, she lights a lamp. Sweeps the house, and searches carefully until she finds it? When she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbors, saying, 'Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost.' Just so, I tell you, there is joy in the presence of the angels of God over one sinner who repents." Luke 15:8-10

Jesus' parable tells about a woman for whom one coin is vital to her existence. Perhaps it has taken her a long time to save this much money for an essential purpose. She panics, because without it, she cannot provide whatever requires that full amount. We are left to wonder what necessary thing she, or perhaps her children, would have to sacrifice because that one coin simply was not there.

How sad it would be if we could not provide the essential ministries to our church family and community if that one coin was simply not there. That is why we carefully plan the ministries we can do based on the income we hope to receive. Thus we make our estimates of giving to help discern just what our church can do for our church family and our neighbors. Are we willing to search out our whole house to provide that one extra coin? Maybe our sacrifice is one less dinner out this month or one less trip to the movie. How much might we save by drinking an extra glass of water a week rather than buying that 20 ounce Coke? We can be so imaginative in saving just a penny or two more to upgrade the ministries of our church. Then angels will rejoice at one person who enters the fellowship of God's family through our efforts.

Well that's not much money you're talking about there, Preacher! No. It isn't. Consider this: Take one cent, ONE CENT, and put it in a jar. Then every day, double the amount in the jar, the second day you would have a whole TWO CENTS! By day thirty, the sum in your jar would exceed \$10.7 MILLION. Yes, that is correct, you do the math. Imagine what could be accomplished starting with just one coin. Got a penny?
