

WHAT'S THE DEAL WITH LENT?

As we discussed in our last issue of The First Word, Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day this year, February 14. Ash Wednesday is also the first day of the holy season of Lent. In the ancient times when the people of Israel were still in Egypt as slaves, the Paschal Lamb was sacrificed so that the angel of death would pass over them, hence the celebration of Passover, a time we have read about often in the Bible. The Paschal Lamb is offered at least annually for the atonement of sin. During this season of Lent, we Christians remember the offering of our Paschal Lamb, Jesus Christ. It is a time to recall Christ's suffering and passion for the sins that we have committed. Beginning on Ash Wednesday, Lent lasts for 40 days (Sundays don't count in the 40 days of Lent, ask me why and I'll tell you.) During this time we remember Jesus denying himself and dying for us. It is here we begin the practice of "giving up something for Lent," which is for us an act of self-denial. However, I have noticed we often give up things to benefit ourselves: desserts, chocolate, beer, coffee, smoking, etc. How about giving up something that makes you a stronger Christian? Give up saying hurtful things, exchange anger for patience, fast from worries and have faith, sacrifice some time for more prayer or Bible study. Let's consider what Jesus did for us and truly observe a HOLY Lent.
