# 7:00 pm – A Celebration of The Eucharist and Tenebrae Service

"Maundy" comes from the Latin word "commandment." Before His crucifixion, Jesus celebrated the Passover for the last time with his disciples. "Tenebrae" is Latin for "shadows." The Tenebrae service dates back to the eighth century and commemorates the passion and death of Jesus Christ. We will begin with subdued lighting. As the candles are extinguished, the darkness deepens. The service will conclude by stripping the sanctuary. After the benediction you are invited to leave in silence to honor this solemn occasion.

## MENTAL HEALTH FIRST AID CLASS

Join in the conversation and community effort to reduce stigma and the silence that surrounds mental illness by taking an Adult Mental Health First Aid Class April 24 and May 1 from 3:30 - 8:00 pm.



1 in 4 Americans will experience mental illness and/or substance use disorder this year. Understanding, knowledge, and skills learned in class can result in giving hope and even in saving lives. It is an eight hour class which prepares participants to recognize signs and symptoms of mental health concerns and then assist the person with a five step action plan.

This class is open to everyone—professionals and lay persons. Participants receive a certificate from the National Council for Behavioral Health. The class is presented by CareNet Counseling of Wilkes: a faith based counseling non-profit affiliate of Wake Forest Baptist Health, through a grant from The Health Foundation. This class will be in the Fellowship Hall of Elkin FUMC. Cost of the class is \$25.00 which includes a resource manual (scholarships available).
