

"Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach. And said, "Children, you have no fish, have you? Cast your net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. — John 21:4-6

Among many passages of scripture that I think of as favorites, John 21 stands near the front of the line. It's really an intriguing passage for me. Add to that, that I have had the privilege to visit that beautiful spot and can envision it whenever I read this text.

First, note that the disciples are at a loss of what to do now that Jesus has been crucified. So they return to what they know—fishing! But that was NOT what Jesus called them to do. He called them to fish for people; but note this: without Jesus' presence or the thought of this presence, they utterly failed. Yet, when the Resurrected Jesus (note the fatherly address of "Children" now) shows up and they are obedient to him, even though it seemed futile, they were overwhelmingly successful. So, there must be something to this obedience thing after all and how successful might our witness be when we begin from a point of obedience to Jesus?



Then, Jesus goes on to ask Peter, "Do you love me more than these?"

These WHAT???

These boats, and nets that have been your life and livelihood up to now? More than these other disciples love me? Do you love me more than other men? In other words, do you love Jesus more than anything else in the world? Enough to be obedient to him? Yes? Then feed his sheep!
