As Jesus began his ministry, among the first things that he did was to gather a band of men together whom he called his disciples. The idea was to train them, teach them, lead them by example and thus to send them into all the world to teach, baptize and share the Good News of salvation with all the world. Over seventeen centuries later, a young Church of England cleric heard God call him to reform the church and to call them to reach out to people starving for grace. He called together some other men at Oxford University to study scripture and learn about Christ's ways and they called themselves the Holy Club. Others derided them for their methodical ways and dubbed them Methodists, and John Wesley adopted that name for a new movement within the church.

Wesley sent out "Methodist" preachers to share the Good News to all, even sending Methodist preachers to the colonies in America. Among their practices was that of Holy Conferencing, where they would meet at least annually to discuss ideas, to share ministries and how people were being reached and to decide which preacher was best suited to go to certain areas. Now, almost three centuries later, Methodists still meet for "Annual Conference" which just concluded at Lake Junaluska, the Methodist retreat center owned and operated by the Southeastern Jurisdiction of the United Methodist Church.

We heard some great sermons and sang boldly in the old Methodist tradition. We discussed ministries and new ideas for ministry and social justice. We heard about Fresh Expressions, new ways to present the Gospel, we heard about ways that lay folk, like yourselves, can be vibrantly involved in ministry. We discussed issues of immigration, human trafficking and other problems our culture is now facing. We ordained, commissioned and licensed, new clergy (including our own Rev. Cindy Furr, who will remain on our staff but add a quarter-time position as pastor of Charity UMC.)

We also heard from Bishop Ken Carter on The Way Forward, the group commissioned by the Council of Bishops at the request of the 2016 General Conference concerning the LGBTQ decision that we just cannot reach an agreement on. (We Methodists have always been a contentious bunch, but usually in a good way). In anticipation of that decision, I feel it vitally important that our entire congregation needs to have conversation concerning this matter in that the idea supported most by the Council of Bishops will require us to decide where we stand on this spectrum. I would much prefer you be educated and communicate your feelings to our church leadership team so that we can identify where we stand as a congregation and not just a decision by a small group of people. I considered doing this in worship via a sermon, but I have decided I really don't want to take worship time to do that. Therefore, I have chosen to take some time as we restart our Wednesday night suppers in the Fall to openly discuss this issue and allow for questions and conversations. If necessary, we could have an evening of conversation separate from our Wednesday night suppers for those who cannot attend the suppers. Please be in prayer that God will guide us. Listen for more information later.
